

## Levanto – Cinque Terre - Portovenere

In a western part of the Liguria Riviera region, the Cinque Terre as well as the two communities north and south of the villages are hemmed in by a setting of outstanding splendor. The delightful scenery of sea, nature, deep and colors is stunning. Do visit this wonderful, easy to reach National Nature Park! We flew into Pisa and took the train up to Cinque Terre. No need for a car, the train works perfectly, also between the villages. We stayed in Corniglia, the smallest and the least touristic of the villages as we thought it would be a perfect starting point for the walks. Next time though, we will pick Levanto as base camp. In Levanto the range of grocery stores and affordable restaurants are excellent. In Cinque Terre we had great difficulty to stock up on food for the day hikes. The food served in most of the restaurants in the villages was mainly fast food quality unless you chose the most exclusive ones. The coastal path between Corniglia, Manarola and Riomaggiore was closed due to repair (June 2013) so we used other paths higher up.

### [Vernaza - Corniglia](#)

Vernaza - Corniglia 4K Suggested starting point: Vernazza train station; Corniglia-Vernazza via sentieri 2; distance 3,4K Corniglia is the oldest and the only settlement of the 5 positioned on high flatland embedded in vines and olive groves. A steep flight of steps leads to the village. The picturesque and rustic village Vernazza with its mediaeval features is facing a tiny bay dominated by rocky cliffs and by two ancient towers.
